
Welcome to our Term 3 Newsletter

Little did we know at the time that the Covid-19 situation would deteriorate and we see would find ourselves having to open our VLE portal and teach online.



ue to the Covid-19 situation in Bangkok this year the school year has been extended to the end of June. A new school calendar was issued and distributed to all parents.


